

- The meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. with a vestry prayer and a devotional from Ephesians by Senior Warden Katherine Coburn. The Senior Warden prepared a list of vestry members holding church keys and provided it to the Junior Warden.
- Reading & Approval of December 30, 2024 minutes. Motion to accept Joshua Chapman, 2nd Van Odom, motion carried.
- Reports of Wardens & Committees
- A. Rector's Reports N/A

B. Wardens' Reports

- 1. Senior Warden (Katherine)
 - a. Follow-Up Unfinished Business
 - 1) Church Management software Van & Nancy will review in February when the annual meeting is complete.
 - Cloud location Katherine and Alex moved the files to the Vestry Portal. Vestry members who are not able to access the Portal should contact Alex or Lance.
 - 3) Social media/website/FB etc no change.
 - 4) Belltower Senior Warden is working to obtain an estimate for potential repairs.
 - 5) Margaret's Garden the Ruby family grant to be submitted by NBN. Muskogee Foundation grant LOI is due January 30. Patrick Shea is working on this. Another option is to pay the NBN grant writer to submit, if needed (about \$280).
 - 6) Fountain some drains in the fountain need better silicone seals, we will work on this in the spring.
 - 7) Church membership list a form will be presented at the annual meeting for parishioners to complete.
 - 8) No sign repair update, vendor not available.
 - 9) Fire department compliance procedure will be reviewed at the annual parish meeting.

11)Pastoral Care/Shut-In Visits, Lay Eucharistic Visitor assignments in place. Van, BJ, Tim Holder and Senior Warden are doing shut-in visits. 12)Card Ministry – we need to get that re-started, volunteer office help could assist.

Motion to accept Treasurer's Report Lora Sellers, 2nd Joshua Chapman, motion carried.

Van Odom recommends we approve the 2025 budget as presented. Motion to accept the budget Pam Lipscomb, 2nd BJ Charbonneau, motion carried with 1 opposed (Stephen Bradley). Stephen Bradley clarified that we are approving a preliminary budget pending future pledges and potential expenses.
